Report of Finances and Activities

2001: Trust fund transferred to Royal Bank of Canada Dominion Securities (RBC-DS)

The Foundation filed a Non-Profit Organization (NPO) Information return for Canada Customs and Revenue Agency and a Form 11 for the year of 2013.

PORTFOLIO BALANCE GROWTH RATES

- > DEC 2006: up by 8.1%
- > DEC 2007: up by 0.3%
- DEC 2008: down by 12.8%
- > DEC 2009: up by 8.5%
- > DEC 2010: up by 5.8%
- > DEC 2011: down by 1.1%
- > DEC 2012: up by 3.5%
- > DEC 2013: up by 8.4%

As of August 29, 2014: up by 6.1% after 8 months since January 2014 or 77% since it's inception (after expenditures)

NEW HOLDINGS

The new account plan called A+ Custom Model prepared by RBC Dominion Securities was approved last year. The General Account stays unchanged. Last April the Access Account, Parameters 1 Account and Parameters 2 Account are combined into 1 new account named A+ or "Combined". The Combined Account is managed by the Mawar Management, an independent investment management firm managing over \$22.6 billion in assets for a broad range of individual, not-forprofit and institutional investors.

WHO CAN APPLY

- Associations with charitable registration numbers and other qualified applicant(s) under the Income Tax Act can apply for funding.
- Organizations who apply for funding must show fiscal responsibility, accountability and good management of their organization.
- Fifty-one percent (51%) of the board members should be Deaf.
- The Foundation does NOT award money to individuals for personal use.

FUNDING MAY BE GRANTED FOR:

- * Arts and Culture
- * Educational Workshops
- * Health and Welfare
- * Information Network

- * Literacy
- * Women's Issues
- * Youth Activities
- * Advocacy

THE APPLICATION PROCESS

If your organization meets the requirements to apply for funding, complete the application form and send it to the Foundation **at least 12 weeks** prior your project's start date to allow time for the Foundation to review your application

Applicants are invited to send their proposals any time throughout the year.


